The UWF met on January 28<sup>th</sup> to begin planning for 2024. The lap quilt/fidget mat project will continue, and Susan Walker has samples and instructions on how to construct them. Materials to make them are available in the sewing room. Currently, the UWF has a request for 10 fidge mats. Blessing bags and cards will continue to be sent in 2024 as well. These bags and cards are sent to those who are not

able to attend church. Bags and cards are sent on alternate months to those unable to attend church. Please let the UWF know if anyone else could benefit from receiving these cards and bags. Currently, 10 to 15 of these are delivered or mailed monthly. The youth will be making cards for the February Blessing Bags, as well as at various times during the year. Thanks to Sharon Marquette for overseeing this mission.

The UWF was blessed to make donations to many causes in 2023. A total of \$2943 was donated to help provide funding for UMCOR Menstrual Hygiene kits, the Salem Youth Mission Trip, the 755 Alliance, UMCOR-Ukraine, and the Harford County Hope for the Homeless Alliance. \$355 was sent for the UWF Conference donation, \$101 toward the Blessing Bags/Cards, and \$75 in memorials to Salem.

We will be working with Salem to move toys and furniture from the old Noah's Ark office and preschool Sunday School room to provide storage and sewing space for the Sewing Samaritans. Amy Krebs hopes to schedule monthly sewing dates (Saturday mornings). There is also yarn available for prayer shawls. Please give completed prayer shawls to Lauren Simpson.

Since all women at Salem are members of the UWF, please let Sue Yurek, Amy Krebs, or Sharon Marquette know of any woman whose activities have benefitted Salem over their lifetime to possibly be recognized with a pin presentation on a Sunday in 2024 (yet to be determined). Please send any suggestions by March 31, 2024.

Fundraising ideas are always welcome! Some ideas for consideration are: make-your-own Christmas ornaments or fabric Christmas trees, December cookie exchange, selling flats of herbs or flowers, a game night with dinner or snacks, a trivia night with dinner or snacks, and soup or cookie mixes.
