Pastor's Message

"For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Matthew 6:21

Our theme for Lent is "Reflections On The Heart." In our worship together, our at-home activities, our Bible study class, our service to others, and our personal devotion, we are invited to look honestly and sincerely into our own hearts. What do you see reflected there? What does your heart treasure? What is your heart saying about your faith?

This Lent, take the time and effort to assess what is reflected in your heart. Remember that your spiritual journey is grounded in the grace of our Savior, Jesus Christ. God's love will hold you secure. The Holy Spirit will guide you in all wisdom and righteousness.

As a congregation, we consider the reflections of our collective heart. What is our spiritual foundation as we move forward in following God's call to increase the impact of our ministry and mission together? How can we use all that God gives us to do *all the good* that we can do as a congregation?

In February we participated in a congregational survey for Salem. Thank you to everyone who completed the survey. Please continue to pray for God's direction as we discern the future ministry of Salem. I want to share a brief update on where we are with our discipleship pathway and our next step. Our plans and timeline have been adjusted to account for my anticipated surgery later this year (approximately 4-6 months from now) and my necessary recovery time.

We would like to set aside time for an informational session to update you on two items: future plans for Salem's ministry and mission in regard to the discipleship pathway program, and answer questions you may have about what is happening with The United Methodist Church. Perhaps you have heard of what other United Methodist churches are doing, and you may be wondering where we are in relationship to the denomination. We will meet together on Sunday, March 26 for a brief time following each of the worship services. (Please note this is a soup order pick-up day and we will make allowance for time to get your soup.) Our Church Council discussed both of these critical updates at our annual planning meeting and we would like to share with the congregation. Please plan to attend if you are interested. Livestreaming will be continue at the conclusion of the 10:45 a.m. service.

During Lent we invite you to give to our special offering. One half goes to support Manna House in providing a daily breakfast- 365 days a year- for those who are in need in Baltimore. In the past, we have participated with volunteers and donations to be a Breakfast Club Sponsor. Our volunteers served breakfast four times a year. We would like to remain a Breakfast Club Sponsor and provide ongoing financial support. Manna House provides more than 68,000 meals per year. We appreciate your support of this vital mission. The other half of our Lenten Offering supports the General Fund. To donate, please mark your check "Lenten Offering." The Helping Hands Food Pantry marked 30 years of service to the community in 2022! Staffed by volunteers from Fork United Methodist, Grace Community, Franklinville Presbyterian, St. Stephen Roman Catholic, St. Paul's Lutheran, and Salem United Methodist, we are honored to be able to house this valuable resource for our community. For the fiscal year that ended on June 30, 2022, the food pantry was able to provide food to 577 families (1503 adults and 627 children). This was done over approximately 900 volunteer hours! - Mission donations were discussed. UMCOR and/or the missions through the UWF Conference will be considered. Donations will be within Salem UMC, in the community and international concerns.
- United Women in Faith Five Channels of Mission Giving: Mission Giving helps United Women in Faith continue to be a strong organization, advocating for and serving the needs of women, children, and youth. A link to a listing of programs funded by UWF: https://uwfaith.org/what-we-do/what-we-fund/ To support this mission, funds are allocated in the yearly donation in five areas of giving to attain the Five Star Giving certification. Salem UWF sends a yearly donation amount (\$300) to the conference with allocations in each of the five channels.
 - Pledge to Mission: Salem UWF contributes yearly as funds allow. The Pledge to Mission
 is the portion of the group's budget that it sets as a goal to send through district and
 conference treasurers to the national office. This money is spent each year for ongoing
 programs of the United Women in Faith National Office and for U.S. and international
 mission projects.
 - 2. **Special Mission Recognition** An individual or local unit or district can honor a special person. A certificate and a gold lapel pin are provided for the honoree. Salem UWF honors two members each year for this recognition.
 - 3. **Gift to Mission**: A gift for mission is sent in honor of any person. Salem UWF honors the two recipients identified for the Special Mission Recognition.
 - 4. **Gift in Memory**: When a Gift in Memory is made, the donor gives to the local or district group's treasurer along with the tear-off portion of the card and sends the card to the family of the deceased. A \$25 memorial donation is given to Salem UMC upon the passing of a church member.
 - 5. **World Thank Offering**: Spontaneous, additional gifts are given out of gratitude for God's abundance and in celebration of the joys of life.

Míssíon Moment

Salem is blessed to support many different missions through your generous giving. Thank you for making a difference in the lives of God's people! Recently, we have given to the following:

- Donated \$500 to Manna House, who provides a daily breakfast and support to the homeless and poor of Baltimore.
- Supported the 6 special offerings for UMC ministries (World Communion, Peace with Justice, UMCOR Sunday, Native American Ministries, Human Relations Day, and United Methodist Student Day).
- Donated \$15 to the Christmas Offering for the Board of Child Care.
- Donated \$375 to UMCOR's general fund for use where most needed.
- Our highlighted mission in January was the shelter program formerly the Emergency Rotating Shelter. We donated meals for all the guests one day and also gave \$742 to support the program. We received this thank you letter from the Harford County Hope for the Homeless Alliance:

Dear Pastor and Congregation of Salem UMC,

The Harford County Hope for the Homeless Alliance thanks you so sincerely for the wonderful donation to the homeless guests we are housing this year. We operate on a grant to help pay the hotel bill and the wonderful generosity of our area churches! Our current shelter situation is 22 adults with 8 children (only the second year that we have been able to assist families in the shelter because of the hotel partnership). You join in this partnering with almost 100 churches and organizations in the County to offer our homeless neighbors not only shelter from winter storms but from the storms of life. This is all accomplished with volunteers and financial support such as yours. This is a serious response to Peter's exhortation (in 1 Peter 4:10): "Be quick to give a meal to the hungry, a bed to the homeless – cheerfully. Be generous with the different things God gave you, passing them around so all get in on it. If words, let it be God's words; if help, let it be God's hearty help. That way, God's bright presence will be evident in everything through Jesus, and he'll get the credit."
