Pastor's Message

On October 10, we gathered virtually with three other churches in our cluster for our Church Conference. I was grateful to share on behalf of Salem about how God is working both in and through our congregation. I reviewed our goals for the past year and how God has blessed us in achieving them. Often, we don't see how much we do on regular basis, because it is part of Salem's servant heart. Please take a moment to rejoice in all the ministry, hard work, and outreach Salem has been able to accomplish over the last year! Below, I've summarized our participation in this year's conference.

We began with our mission statement: We are called to be active in God's blessing of the world through our commitment to welcoming one another, growing in grace, serving our neighbors, and caring for all God's people. Then, we moved on to talking about how we reached our goals, reflecting on how they tie into our mission.

Goal #1: Path of congregational vitality

- Congregational participation in our Readiness 360 survey
- Identify Salem's strengths and focus how we share Jesus Christ in our community
- Use of MissionInsite tools to gain strategic knowledge about our community
- Review of our mission statement (accomplished through a sermon series this year)

Goal #2: Replace the sound system in the sanctuary

Goal #3: Transition from Zoom meeting platform to streaming to our website for worship (later service)

Goal #4: Comprehensive revision of the Safe Sanctuary policies and procedures

- Over a period of several months, members of the Staff-Parish Relations Committee researched best practices and worked to draft a new policy and procedures
- Paid staff and other leaders have taken additional training through Safe Gatherings
- Provided training for our volunteers who work with children/youth; parents and others interested were invited as well; working to implement all of our new policies and procedures
- Provided a congregational information session on October 22
- Copies of the new policy are available in several places in our buildings: sanctuary narthex, chapel, parlor, nursery, elementary Sunday School/Junior Church room, youth room, and Salem House (office). If you are interested in a copy, please contact the church office. We will have information on our website as well.
- Resource books are available from Pastor Stacey if you would like to have more information on various aspects of safe sanctuary policy and practices.

Additional celebrations at our Church Conference included the following:

- 1. Youth Missions the summer mission trip to Altoona, PA; serving at the local laundromat and partnership with 755 Alliance of Edgewood
- 2. Salem's support of UMCOR Hawaii relief; Ukraine Relief; Turkey/Syria Relief; US Disaster Relief. Also, specific support given for Lahaina UMC. Specifically, \$1,050 was donated to UMCOR Hawaii and \$4,680 to Lahaina UMC.
- 3. Local Missions Magnolia Elementary School, Magnolia Middle School, Harford Community Action Agency, New Hope Day Shelter, and Manna House Breakfast Club (Baltimore City).
- 4. Community Engagement: Helping Hands Food Pantry, Perry Hall Food Pantry, Trunk or Treat, Aerobics, Luna's House Animal Rescue Center, and Prayer Shawls for Franklin Square Hospital. New this year Prayer For Christian Unity Service in January sponsored by community churches; we opened our building for a new AA group to meet.
- 5. Salem's lay speaker Paul Krebs was affirmed in his ministry.
- 6. We claim God's promise given to Abram and Sarai, "You will be a blessing.
