I want to express my heartfelt gratitude for your generous Christmas gift. I appreciate your kindness and generosity. Many of you sent cards and I have enjoyed reading each one. I especially love the cards with pictures of your families! Thanks, also, for your thoughtful individual gifts. I am blessed to serve as your pastor and to work with you in serving God together.

Rick and I decided to give our church family a special gift this year – the wooden nativity scene that has been displayed outside. We hope you enjoy it as a celebration of God's love in Jesus Christ.

We continue to celebrate the Christmas Season into January with the Celebration of Epiphany ("Star Sunday") on Sunday, January 7 and our Celebration of the Lord's Baptism on Sunday, January 14.

Also in January we will celebrate the birthday of Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. with an opportunity for service on Monday, January 15, 2024. Our youth will be going to serve at the laundromat that day, and we will gather at Salem to serve. We will be focusing on three projects:

- 1. Assembling gift bags for the families being served through winter housing. We need the following new items: coloring books for all ages; crayons; winter hats in all sizes; small puzzles; socks in all sizes; children's books; deodorant; and toothpaste. If you would like to donate, please bring your items to church by Sunday, January 14.
- 2. Baking cookies and/or cooking for local first responders.
- 3. Creating cards and coloring pages birthday cards for Board of Child Care youth; thinking of you coloring pages for the United Women of Faith to use in their blessing bags for members of our church family; other cards to be sent to members of our church family to remind them of our loving prayers.

Everyone is invited to participate. We will work from 10:00 a.m. until 1:00 p.m. in the fellowship hall.

I would like to thank you for your continuing prayers. As I have shared with you, I will be having surgery to replace my temporomandibular joints; currently my surgery is scheduled for February 2, 2024. Working with the Staff-Parish Relations Committee, I have arranged for a wonderful retired clergy colleague, Reverend Melissa McDade, to serve Salem while I am recuperating and healing from my surgery. I am grateful she is willing to come for this time; she will be preaching and leading worship as well as providing pastoral care. We will give you more details in the February newsletter. Security Alert >>>

Safety and security have to always be at the forefront of all that we do for our staff, families, and for those who visit our church each week. There has been a recent uptick in people leaving our exterior doors unlocked. There are many people within our church who have keys to the building, so it is hard to pinpoint who may have unknowingly left the doors unlocked. There are occasions where people will unlock one door to enter the building, forget to relock the door, and then leave the church out of another door. For obvious reasons, this has to stop for the safety of everyone who comes into the building and to ensure we are never vulnerable to a break-in, theft, and/or destruction of property. We have had several recent incidents of homeless people coming to our church or food pantry who have shown outward signs of having mental health issues. We can never allow ourselves to be vulnerable to any type of attack or, again, allow entry into our church for theft or destruction. Please be vigilant and do YOUR part to ensure the personal safety of everyone in our church.

General Reminders:

- Stay alert for any suspicious activity, especially when entering and leaving the church.
- When at church for evening activities, particularly when it's dark, use the buddy system and walk together whenever you can. LOCK the doors once you enter the church.
- Ensure your car is locked and that all valuables are secure and out-of-sight! (i.e., loose change, money, spare keys, cell phones, backpacks, computer bags, etc.)
- Carry a small container of mace and have it ready at all times. It's inexpensive and effective!
- LOCK the doors once you leave the church..

Winter Housing Update >>>

As a church, Salem is very mission oriented. Whenever issued a challenge to meet a need, our Salem family always steps up! This winter season, we have taken on the challenge to relocate as many homeless families who are living in their cars as possible. You have been very generous toward meeting these needs, and Salem is very grateful to you for your commitment – "Whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me. (Matthew 25:40)"

To date, the food pantry has been very generous and donated \$6,279 to house one family for the 13 week program. Our United Women in Faith refocused their funds from the sale of grocery bags and Christmas ornaments, totaling \$1,143, to support this mission. In addition to those funds, our Salem family has donated \$9,809. Thanks to everyone's generosity, we have sent a check for \$10,952 from Salem!

The children in these families will now be able to stay warm and stretch out while sleeping in a comfortable bed, having completed their homework at a well-lit able and eating a hot meal. Thank you so much for providing loving care for some of "the least of these."
