## What is Lent and why does it last 40 days? >>>

Lent is a season of forty days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. Lent comes from the Anglo Saxon word *lencten*, meaning "lengthen" and refers to the lengthening days of spring. The forty days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan and preparing to begin his ministry.

Lent is a time of repentance, fasting and preparation for the coming of Easter. It is a time of self-examination and reflection. In the early church, Lent began as a period of fasting and preparation for baptism by new converts and then became a time of penance by all Christians. Today, Christians focus on relationship with God, growing as disciples and extending ourselves, often choosing to give up something or to volunteer and give of ourselves for others.

Sundays in Lent are not counted in the forty days because each Sunday represents a "mini-Easter." This is why you will see the designation "Sunday in Lent" rather than "Sunday of Lent" in the naming of these Sundays. On each Lord's Day in Lent, while Lenten fasts continue, the reverent spirit of Lent is tempered with joyful anticipation of the Resurrection.

A Choice of Directions

Lent gives us an opportunity to look again at who we are, at where we're going in life, at how we're getting to where we say we want to go. The Chinese say, "If you don't know where you're going, any road will take you there." But the aimlessness, the confusion, the anomie that goes with it, wears us down, wears us out.

Everybody needs to know that they have lived for something. Everyone has a responsibility to leave this world better than when they found it. Everyone needs to carry a light into the darkness of the world around them so that others, too, may follow and find the way.

To go through life with no thought of responsibility for anything other than the self is to live like a leech off the riches of the world around us. To ask the question, What is my life goal? What am I contributing to this world? And to hear no answer in the echo of the soul, is to be living a hollow life indeed.

Lent does not permit us the luxury of such banality. Lent ends in the shadow of the empty cross and in the sunrise of an empty tomb. There are great things to be done by us and each of them takes great effort, requires great struggle, will face great resistance. But the way to the empty tomb goes through the mount of the cross.


Lent is our time to prepare to carry the crosses of the world ourselves. The people around us are hungry; it is up to us to see that they are fed, whatever the cost to ourselves. Children around us are in danger on the streets; it us up to us to see that they are safe...It is up to us to soften the hearts of our own government so that the rest of the world can live a life of dignity and pride.

We must "set our faces like flint," let nothing deter the Jesus life in us, knowing that however our efforts end, the resurrection is surely on its way.

Lent puts options before us. We can choose to be open or heardhearted, attuned to God or closed to everything but the self, full of faith or drowned in despair, stagnant or full of life. Lent is a choice of directions.

One more thing: thank you for welcoming Tom and me, and our grandsons. It is a joy to serve your church for these weeks as Stacey recovers!

#### Helping Hands Food Pantry Update >>>

Wow! What a joy filled meeting! On January 22, 2024, the board of the pantry, all dedicated volunteers (kindred spirits), met to plan ways to expand our ministry of Helping Hands to the needy.

After opening in prayer, everyone began listing the bounty of blessings our Lord has bestowed upon our pantry operation.

Through the generous supplies of food and monetary contributions of local churches, friends, and supporters, we are able to continue our daily operation of helping 614 families in need (composed of 1560 adults and 621 children) for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2023. Also, we recently spent more than \$6000 supplying housing, necessities, and future hope to a group of homeless persons who had no other resources or places to turn.

It soon became clear to all of us that the more anyone gives to the hungry, thirsty, widows, widowers, orphans, those in prison, sick, etc., the Lord just reigns down His bounty, overwhelming us with His gifts of love. **We know it's a fact, our God can supply all of our needs.** 

Because of large monetary contributions from individuals and organizations with a similar vision as the pantry, our shelves are well stocked. We have a good inventory, so we decided to share our good fortune with others.

After discussion, the board of directors made a decision to send contributions to 13 organizations who supply and help the less fortunate among us. Included are soup kitchens, prison ministries, battered women and children shelters, the homeless found among the blind, 2 overseas organizations that supply food, clothing, medication and place of refuge for displaced persons because of wars and famine, and a couple of fledgling churches who provide food and pantry items on a limited basis.

We wish you could be there and participate in these efforts with us. We thought it would be best to inform you of this good news and say thank you, thank you!

As an old saying goes, we washed a lot of feet by serving Christ and others.



If you're interested in seeing "Daniel," please let Judy Jones know. She is organizing a group to see the production in June 2024.




#### In Memoriam >>>
