### Pastor's Message

"A voice cries out: 'In the wilderness prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God. Every valley shall be lifted up, and every mountain and hill be made low; the uneven ground shall become level, and the rough places a plain. Then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it together, for the mouth of the Lord has spoken." – Isaiah 40:3-5 (NRSV)

"Preparing the Way" is our Advent theme this year. The scripture above from the book of Isaiah depicts in dramatic language the transforming work of God in our world. How do we participate with God in preparing the way that shapes the redemption and transformation of all creation? We will be exploring components of our work of preparation in worship each Sunday of Advent. Here is the schedule with the scripture lesson of the week. (You can read the scriptures before each worship and be prepared!)

December 3 – Preparing to Bring **Hope**: Jeremiah 33:14-16 December 10 – Preparing to Make **Peace**: Luke 3:2b-6 December 17 – Preparing to Have **Joy**: Philippians 4:4-7 December 24 – Preparing to Embrace **Love**: Luke 1:39-45

#### Providing Hope to Families in Need >>>

A warm bath and comfy pajamas. Sleeping in a soft bed in a warm house. Coffee and a hot breakfast before starting your day. Do these things sound familiar to you?

What about adding another pair of socks, a sweatshirt, and a hat before covering yourself with a blanket and settling in the back seat of a car? Trying to sleep with four other family members through a cold, frigid night? Waking up to change clothes in that same cold car, before starting your day with minimal food and ice cold water?

There are forty families here in our neighborhoods who face life in a car during the winter months. We don't like to think about it, but there are children who get up and go to school having slept in that cold car.



The Harford County Hope for Homeless Alliance (HCHHA) is trying to get these families in need out of their cars this winter, but they need our help. Their goal is to get those families into hotels for thirteen weeks – through the coldest part of the winter. HCHHA has shared with us that \$69 will house one family for one night at a hotel; \$483 will house one family for one week, and \$6,279 will house one family for all thirteen weeks.

We're reaching out to you – our Salem family – to help those families that need assistance. Any donation amount is welcome. It all adds up! Your family will be sleeping warm and well fed – will your family help another family? If you find it in your heart to accept our Salem challenge to house these families, please note "Winter Housing" on the memo line of your check. If donating online at salemunited.org/donate, please be sure to select "Donate Now" under "Give Online." In the new page that opens, please select "Winter Housing" from the first drop down menu.

#### Soup Sale is back >>>

Colder weather has arrived and it's soup time again. Let the kitchen crew take care of your dinner! The cost of a quart of soup is \$12.00, but consider if you dine out the least amount you will pay for a cup of soup is \$6 to \$8. Many places are charging \$9 to \$10 per cup. With our soup sale, you are getting four times the amount of a cup in a restaurant for half to three quarters of the price!

Our first soup, as announced, is Maryland Shrimp Soup, to be picked up on Sunday, December 10<sup>th</sup> (order form can be found at the end of the newsletter). This soup may be frozen! Other soups will follow. In January, be on the lookout for our Potato Cheddar soup. February will feature Chicken Corn Chowder or Chicken Rice Soup. In March, we will have Broccoli Cheddar soup. #### WHAT TO REMEMBER:

- 1. Never send money, gift cards, wire transfers or virtual currency to anyone you haven't met in person
- 2. Ask for the opinion of others, such as friends or family members, before taking any action
- 3. Slow down and think about what you are doing. Scammers will try to do everything fast and encourage you to make quick decisions. You don't have to move fast. Take your time. Think before you do anything.

#### Most common types of Elder Fraud:

Romance Scams: pretend to be someone they are not, take time to earn your trust, say all the right things

- Will not meet you in person
- Encourage you to communicate outside of dating site
- Always have excuses as to why they cannot meet and why they need your help
- Ask for gift cards, money, open bank accounts, and other items of value.

Tech Fraud Scam: pretend to be someone from certain IT companies like McAfee or Norton

- Want remote access to your computer
- Will over pay you during a rebate or refund
- Ask you to send the money back to them via gift cards, cash, wire transfers and/or virtual currency
- Will call you frequently throughout the day trying to pressure you into sending the money fast
